SEE Forum on Climate Change Adaptation

Croatian Network

- Formed by civil society organizations from the environmental, humanitarian, economic and social areas of work
- Raises awareness about impacts of climate change, promotes sustainable development and disaster risk reduction
- Priorities: water, energy, agriculture and forestry, land use and transport, health and disaster risk reduction

Climate Reaction (Macedonia)

- Gathers civil society organizations working in the fields of environment, education, development, democracy, humanitarian and health assistance, social affairs and business
- Fosters sustainable development to reduce disaster risk and health consequences of climate change of the population
- Priorities: health, disaster risk and response, agriculture and forestry, water and energy

Climate Response (Montenegro)

- Comprised of different civil society organizations from the environmental, humanitarian, democracy development and health sector, business sector, as well as universities and representatives of governmental and international institutions
- Raises awareness about climate change and its consequences, within the general public and decision-makers
- Priorities: water, energy, agriculture and forestry, land use and transport, health and disaster risk reduction

Climate Forum (Serbia)

- Made up of non-governmental organizations from the environmental, democracy development, humanitarian and health sector, members of UN Global Compact and governmental institutions
- Forms partnerships among social, economic, humanitarian and environmental organizations to deal with challenges faced in areas of environment and climate change
- Raises awareness of relationships between climate and development
- Advocates international climate justice
